Types of Professional Dress

Business Casual

A polished yet relaxed look. Best for networking events, casual office environments, and everyday workplace wear.

Business Professional

A step up from business casual. Best for interviews, corporate offices, and finance and law industries.

Business Formal

The most professional attire, typically requiring a full matching suit. Best for high-level business meetings, formal corporate events, and industries with strict dress codes.



FEMININE

Business Casual

Tops & Dresses

- Blouses, sweaters, or structured tops in neutral or soft colors.
- Knee-length or midi dresses with modest necklines

Pants

- Tailored trousers, midi skirts, or dressy ankle-length pants
- Dark jeans (if appropriate)

Jackets

 Blazers and cardigans can elevate the look but aren't always necessary

Shoes

- Flats, loafers, low heels, or ankle boots
- Clean, leather sneakers





Business Professional

Tops

- Button-down shirts, blouses, or tailored sweaters; solid or subtle patterns work best
- Knee-length or midi dresses with modest necklines

Pants

• Well-fitted dress pants or pencil skirts in neutral colors

Suits & Jackets

- Structured blazers in neutral colors or minimal patterns
 Shoes
- Closed-toe pumps or dressy flats

Business Formal

Suits & Jackets

- A matching pantsuit or skirt suit in neutral tones
- Choose high-quality fabric when possible

Blouses & Dresses

- Silk or structured blouses with a tailored fit
- Dresses should be knee-length or longer

Shoes

- Closed-toe heels (2-4 inches) in neutral shades or dressy flats
- Black or nude shades are best





MASCULINE

Business Casual

Tops

- Collared shirts (button-downs, polos) or sweaters.
- Fitted, opaque, plain t-shirts

Pants

- Chinos or dress pants
- Dark jeans (if appropriate)

Jackets

 Blazers and sportcoats can elevate the look but aren't always necessary

Shoes

- · Loafers, oxfords, or other flat dress shoes
- Clean, leather sneakers





Business Professional

Tops

 Crisp, collared button-down shirts in solid or subtle patterns, tucked in

Pants

Well-fitted dress pants in neutral colors (black, gray, navy)

Suits & Jackets

• A well-fitted blazer or suit jacket is very common, often expected

Shoes

• Polished dress shoes (Oxfords, Derbies, or loafers) in black or brown

Business Formal

Suits & Jackets

- A full matching suit in dark, neutral colors (black, navy, charcoal); tailored fit is best
- White or light-colored dress shirts
- Tie in a classic pattern or solid color

Shoes

 Black or dark brown dress shoes (Oxfords or cap-toe Derbies), clean and well-maintained





GENDER NEUTRAL

Business Casual

Tops

- Button-up shirts (solid colors, subtle patterns) or collared polos
- Fitted, opaque, plain t-shirts in dark colors
- Professional or traditional looking sweaters or cardigans (layered over a collared shirt or worn alone)

Pants

- Comfortable, well-fitted trousers, slacks, or chinos
- Dark jeans (if permitted)
- Avoid anything with holes or that is too baggy

Jackets

 Blazers and sports coats can elevate the look but aren't always necessary

Shoes

- Loafers, oxfords, or other flat dress shoes
- Chelsea boots
- Clean, leather dress sneakers





Business Professional

Tops

• Button-up shirts (neutral colors or subtle patterns)

Pants

Tailored dress pants (straight-leg, slim-fit, or wide-leg)

Suits & Jackets

Well-fitted blazers (single-breasted or double-breasted) or vests

Shoes

- Oxfords or loafers in black or brown
- Chelsea or lace up professional boots

Business Formal

Suits & Jackets

- Button-up shirts (white or light colors)
- Full matching suit (jacket + trousers in the same fabric and color)
- Dark, neutral colors (black, navy, charcoal, deep gray)
- Single-breasted or double-breasted blazer with structured shoulders

Shoes

• Oxfords or loafers in black or brown
